

Picks for St. Jude

The players picked here may or may not be the best players in the world. The players chosen either are playing decently going into the event or have a decent record at the St. Jude. As indicated on the spreadsheet, most of the field is made up of players ranked outside the top 150 in the world rankings.

Brian Gay – He seems to be playing well recently and has won at St. Jude's before with only one finish outside the top 20 in the last 5 years.

Lee Westwood - Westwood won here last year and has 3 top 10 finishes coming into the event.

David Toms - He seems to play the course well and has a second and a win in his last 2 events played.

Zach Johnson - He has 2 top 10s in his last 3 events played and has a 12th place finish and a 4th place finish in the only 2 times he's played St. Jude's in the last 5 years.

Sergio Garcia - Garcia seems to be coming on stronger with 3 top 20 finishes in his last 3 starts.

Brandt Snedeker - After missing 2 consecutive cuts, Snedeker finished 16th in his most recent event played, which is a good trend. He has mixed finishes at St. Jude's with only 1 top 5 in the past 4 years.

Retief Goosen - Goosen has a couple of decent finishes in his last 2 starts on the European Tour, which could translate to a good finish this week.

Fredrik Jacobson - Jacobson has been trending well lately by improving his finish in each of his last 4 starts. And, he's done the same over the past 3 years at St. Jude's.

Jonathan Byrd - Byrd has 2 top 10s in his last 3 starts, could be a breakthrough week for him, although his record at St. Jude's isn't too good.

Robert Karlsson - Karlsson finished 2nd last year at St. Jude's in his first time playing the event. But he hasn't had the best of finishes over the past 5 tournaments he's played.

Camilo Villegas - Villegas seems to play the course fairly decently as indicated by his finishes, however, his finishes in recent events isn't too hot. But he's trending a little by finishing 30th in his last event after missing the cut in the event prior. This could be a breakthrough week for him.

John Rollins – Rollins had a top 15 finish in the event last year after having not played it in the previous 4 and he's coming off a 6th place finish in the last event he played.

Bryce Molder – Molder could be trending, like Villegas, Molder's recent finishes are cut, 30th. Plus, Molder finished 2nd in his only start at St. Jude's 2 years ago.

D.A. Points – Points is also a trending player, however, not a very good record at St. Jude's.
