The Canadian Open picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Matt Kuchar — Kuchar has back to back top 10 finishes coming into the Canadian Open, he's playing well and usually can run off many top 10s in a row.

Hunter Mahan — Mahan has 3 top 20 finishes in a row including a 19th place finish at last week's Open Championship.

Bo Van Pelt — Van Pelt missed the cut last week at the Open Championship, however, he was 2nd in his previous start to it.

Ryan Palmer — Although Palmer missed the cut in his last start, he played well up to that point. He could bounce back in this event, like Van Pelt.

Charl Schwartzel — Schwartzel has top 20 finishes in 3 of his last 5 starts. And, he's a top 10 finish in his only Canadian Open start.

Brandt Snedeker — Snedeker could go either way here, he could continue solid play from the Open Championship or have a letdown from what "could have been" there. He's also on a trend and has 2 top 10 finishes at the Canadian Open.

Jim Furyk – Furyk is on a trend and he's won the Canadian Open before.

Spencer Levin – Levin is on a trend.

Sean O'Hair — O'Hair was on a trend culminating in a top 10 and ended with a missed cut. He's the defending champion at the Canadian Open and should bounce back.

Ernie Els — Els may continue his solid play and is a player who can win back to back even following a major win.
