**Luke Donald** — Donald didn't have a great week at The Masters last week, however, he plays Harbour Town well, 3 top 5 finishes over the past 3 years played. Plus, he's still the number 1 ranked player in the world.

**Bo Van Pelt** – Van Pelt has finished inside the top 20 for 3 straight tournaments played. On Sunday at Augusta last week he tied the final round course record.

**Matt Kuchar** – Kuchar notched his 4<sup>th</sup> top 10 in a row at the Masters last week. He doesn't have the strongest record at Harbour Town, but finished 7<sup>th</sup> in '08.

**Jim Furyk** – The last time Furyk won this tournament he was coming off a missed cut at the Masters and he was angry at his poor play at Augusta. This time however, he's been playing well and somewhat back to Furyk-esque form. He should contend this week.

**Aaron Baddeley** – Baddeley is on a bit of a trend and played Harbour Town well over the past 5 years, 22<sup>nd</sup> his worst finish. He also won this event in '06.

**Brandt Snedeker** – Snedeker won at Harbour Town last year is on a 2-event trend, 63<sup>rd</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> at the Masters last week.

**Jason Dufner** — Dufner could be a stretch after having a not so good weekend at Augusta last week. If he could pick up his weekend play a bit, he'd be winning in bunches.

**Jeff Overton** — Overton has 2 top 5 finishes and 2 top 20 finishes over his last 5 tournaments played, he's relatively hot.

**Ernie Els** – Els seems to be slowly but surely regaining some of his older form, when he used to contend week in and week out. Els has 2 top 5 finishes and a 12<sup>th</sup> in his last 3 tournaments played. Not the best record at Harbour Town, but a 2<sup>nd</sup> in '07 could help. He also may be more motivated to win since he failed to qualify for the Masters this year.
