Wyndham Picks 2013

Wyndham picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Zach Johnson – Johnson is basically the hottest player in the field with 4 top 10 finishes in a row coming into the event. The last time he played Wyndham was in 2008, finishing 26th.

Rory Sabbatini – Sabbatini is on a trend with a top 10 finish in his most recent event played. Sabbatini has 4 top 20 finishes in his last 5 events played coming into Wyndham.

Webb Simpson – Simpson won this event in 2011 and he has 2 top 25 finishes in his last 2 events played.

Carl Pettersson – Pettersson has 3 top 5 finishes at Wyndham in the last 5 years played, including a win, however, his best recent event is a 54th place finish (5 events played).

Daniel Summerhays – Summerhays had 3 top 10 finishes in a row prior to missing the cut at the Canadian (his most recent played.) He missed the cut last year at Wyndham, 17th in 2011.

Boo Weekley – Weekley is on a 3 week trend coming into the Wyndham with a 12th place finish at the PGA last week. Wyndham finishes, not so great, 2 missed cuts, 53rd and 32nd over last 4 years.

David Toms – Toms is on a trend with a top 20 finish followed by a top 10 last week in his 2 most recent events played. Best finish at Wyndham over the last 5 years is 2nd in 2010.

Hideki Matsuyama – Matsuyama hasn't finished outside the top 25 in his last 5 events played. He's also on a slight trend coming into Wyndham.

Chez Reavie — Reavie is on a trend coming into this tourney and he has 2 top 10 finishes in his last 3 starts at Wyndham.

Bill Haas — Haas has 3 top 10s in his last 5 events played, including a win. Haas also has 2 top 10 finishes at Wyndham over the last 4 years.
