

Zurich Picks 2013

Harbour Town picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Jason Dufner – Dufner is the defending champion with 4 consecutive top 10 finishes in the last 4 years played at Zurich. Dufner's best finish in his last 5 events played though is 12th.

Bubba Watson – Watson finished 18th here last year and he won in 2011. He's finished in the top 20 in 2 of his last 3 events, still not quite the same consistency as last year.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler finished with a top 10 last year after a 26th place finish in 2011 (his first start at the Zurich). Fowler has 1 top 10 finish in his last 5 starts coming into this event.

Keegan Bradley – Bradley put an end to his 4 consecutive top 10 finishes with his 82 on Saturday at Augusta (to finish 54th). We'd like to think he'll rebound here.

Nick Watney – Watney is on a trend and he won here in 2007. But maybe Watney just had a career year in 2011, not a breakout year.

Justin Rose – Rose has finished in the top 10 in 3 of his last 4 events played - ending the streak with a 25th place finish at Augusta. He finished 10th at Zurich last year, so maybe he's found some kind of comfort level at this particular TPC course.

Jeff Overton – Overton seems to be a bit like Watney, but replace 2011 with 2010. With a couple of top 20 finishes at the Zurich (18th last year) and 2nd in 2010, to go along with his current trend, perhaps he can get a win.

Brendon de Jonge – de Jonge has 2 top 10 finishes in his last 3 events, he's on a trend, he's never won before, and he's bettered his finish in each of his last 2 starts at Zurich...

Cameron Tringale – Tringale is the guy. Although he missed the cut in his last start, he finished 16th the week prior and he's bettered his finish at Zurich in each of his last 2 starts here.

Fredrik Jacobson – Jacobson has top 25 place finishes in each of his last 5 starts coming into Zurich.
