The Masters Picks 2014

Masters picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Adam Scott – Scott is the defending champion, he's on a trend with 3 top 10s in his most recent 5 events played and 3 top 10 finishes in a row at the Masters, including last year's win.

Phil Mickelson — Mickelson won this event 3 times, he always seems to finish well here, except for last year.

Bubba Watson — Watson has a win, 2 second place finishes and a 9th place finish in his 5 most recent events played, however, his last round played was an 82. But, he also won the Masters 2 years ago.

Lee Westwood – Westwood is on a trend, he finished 17th at Shell last week. Westwood has 3 top 10 finishes at Augusta in the last 4 years, he finished 11th in the other year.

Rory McIlroy – McIlroy is also on a trend and he has 3 top 10 finishes in his 5 most recent events played. McIlroy's best finish at Augusta in the last 5 years is 15th.

Sergio Garcia – Garcia has 4 top 10 finishes in his 5 most recent events played, the finish not a top 10 was 16th place finish. Garcia finished 8th at the Masters last year.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson was on a trend prior to his 54th place finish last week. Stenson finished 18th at Augusta last year.

Luke Donald – Donald has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Donald's best finish at Augusta in the last 5 years was 4th in 2011.

Charl Schwartzel — Schwartzel won the Masters in 2011 and he has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler is on a trend and he has 2 top 10s in his last 5 recent events played.
