John Deere picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Zach Johnson – Johnson is on a trend and finished 6th in his most recent event played. Johnson finished top 3 at John Deere the past 4 years straight, including a win in 2012.

Jordan Spieth – Spieth finished top 3 in 3 of 4 of his most recent events played, including a win (U.S. Open). Spieth won John Deere in 2013 and finished 7th last year.

Kevin Kisner – Kisner is on a trend and he's finished in the top 12 in his most recent 4 events played. Kisner finished 20th at this event last year.

Tony Finau — Finau finished in the top 25 in his 5 most recent events played. This is his first John Deere tourney.

Ryan Moore — Moore was on a trend prior to missing the cut at the U.S. Open. Moore has 2 top 10 finishes at the John Deere in the past 3 years.

Steven Bowditch — Bowditch has 2 top 15 finishes in his most recent 2 events played. Bowditch is on a slight trend as well and he's 2 top 12 finishes at John Deere in the past 2 years.

Shawn Stefani – Stefani is on a trend with a 13th finish in his most recent event played and he finished 13th at this event last year.

Chez Reavie — Reavie has 3 top 25 finishes in his most recent 3 events played. Reavie finished 15th at this tourney in 2013 and he finished 5th in 2011.

Harris English – English is on a slight trend and he hasn't missed a cut in his most recent 4 events played. English finished 15th at John Deere in 2013.
