Rickie Fowler – Fowler is on a trend coming into Deutsche Bank with a 7th last week at Barclays. Fowler is the defending champion of this event.

Ryan Moore – Moore has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a win. Moore finished 10th at Deutsche Bank in 2010 and in 2011.

Hideki Matsuyama – Matsuyama has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 3 events played. Matsuyama finished 25th at this event last year.
