John Deere picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Zach Johnson – Johnson has 5 top 3 finishes at John Deere over the past 5 years, including a win and 2 second's.

Steve Stricker – Stricker won this event 3 times in a row, in 2009, 2010 and 2011. Stricker has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played.

Ryan Moore – Moore is on a trend coming into this event and he's 4 top 25 finishes at John Deere over the past 4 years, including 2 top 10s.

Kevin Na – Na has 3 top 25 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Na finished 13th at this tourney in 2014.

Robert Streb – Streb is on a trend coming into this tourney with a 7th place finish in his most recent event played. Streb finished 14th at John Deere last year.

Daniel Summerhays – Summerhays is another player on a trend coming into this event and he finished 8th last year, and 4th in 2013.

Patrick Rodgers – Rodgers is also on a trend coming into this tourney with a 3rd place finish in his most recent event played. Rodgers finished 15th at this tourney in 2013.

Jon Rahm – Rahm finished in the top 25 in 3 of his most recent events played, including 2 top 5 finishes.

Spencer Levin – Levin is on a trend coming into this event with 2 top 15 finishes in his most recent 2 events played.

Brian Harman – Harman has 2 top 25 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a top 10. Harman won this event in 2014.
