BMW picks are based mostly on recent performance with some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Dustin Johnson – Johnson has 5 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Johnson is the defending champion, albeit not at this course.

Jordan Spieth — Spieth has 3 top 2 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Spieth has 3 top 15 finishes at this event over the past 3 years.

Justin Thomas – Thomas has 2 wins in his most recent 3 events played. Thomas finished 13th at the BMW in 2015, when the event was last held at this course.

Paul Casey — Casey has 5 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 3 top 5s. Casey finished 2nd at BMW last year and he was 32nd the year prior.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson has 5 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Stenson finished 10th at this tourney in 2015.

Patrick Reed — Reed is on a trend coming into the BMW and he's 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2 top 10s.

Justin Rose – Rose has back to back top 10 finishes coming into this event. Rose finished 13th at this venue in 2015.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including 2 top 10s. Fowler finished 4th at BMW in 2015.

Hideki Matsuyama – Matsuyama is on a trend coming into this event and he's 4 top 25 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. 7th in 2015.

Jon Rahm – Rahm has 2 top 5 finishes in his most recent 2 events played.
