The Masters 2018 Picks

The Masters picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Justin Rose – Rose has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Rose has 3 top 10 finishes in the last 3 years at The Masters, including 2 seconds.

Jordan Spieth – Spieth is on a trend coming into The Masters to go with 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Spieth has 4 top 15 finishes at Augusta over the past 4 years (a win, 2 seconds).

Justin Thomas – Thomas has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Thomas finished 22nd at The Masters last year.

Paul Casey – Casey has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Casey has 3 top 10 finishes at Augusta over the past 3 years.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Stenson has 3 top 20 finishes over the past 5 years at The Masters.

Sergio Garcia – Garcia has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 3 events played. Garcia is the defending champion.

Bubba Watson – Watson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including 2 wins. Watson won The Masters in 2014 and 2012.

Tiger Woods – Woods has 4 top 25 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2 top 5s. Woods won The Masters 4 times.

Rory McIlroy – McIlroy has 2 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. McIlroy has 4 top 10 finishes at Augusta over the past 4 years.

Phil Mickelson – Mickelson has 5 top 25 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 3 top 10s. Mickelson has a second place finish at The Masters in 2015 and 3 Masters wins.
