Dustin Johnson – Johnson has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2 wins. Johnson won here in 2016.

Francesco Molinari – Molinari has 2 wins and 2 seconds in his most recent 5 events played. He finished 24th last year at Bridgestone.

Justin Rose – Rose has 5 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Rose has 2 top 5 finishes at this event over the past 4 years.

Tiger Woods – Woods has 2 top 10 finishes in his most recent 2 events played. Woods has won this event 8 times.

Rory McIlroy – McIlroy is on a trend coming into this tourney with 3 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. McIlroy finished 5th last year and he won this event in 2014.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Fowler finished in the top 10 at this event the past 4 years.

Jordan Spieth – Spieth is on a trend coming into Bridgestone and he finished in the top 15 in each of the past 3 years at this tourney.

Paul Casey – Casey has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Casey also has 3 top 20 finishes at this event over the past 3 years.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson has 4 top 30 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Stenson has 4 top 20 finishes at Bridgestone over the past 5 years, including 2 top 10s.

Zach Johnson – Johnson has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Johnson has 3 top 10 finishes at this event over the past 5 years.
