

WGC Mexico 2018 Picks

WGC Mexico picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Dustin Johnson – Johnson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including a win. Johnson is the defending champion.

Justin Thomas – Thomas has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win at Honda last week. Thomas finished 5th at WGC Mexico last year.

Tommy Fleetwood – Fleetwood has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Fleetwood finished 2nd at this tourney last year.

Justin Rose – Rose is on a trend coming into WGC Mexico to go with 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Rose finished 38th at this event last year.

Jon Rahm – Rahm has 3 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Rahm finished 3rd at WGC Mexico last year.

Paul Casey – Casey has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Casey finished 16th at this tourney last year.

Tyrrell Hatton – Hatton has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Hatton finished 10th at this event last year.

Tony Finau – Finau is on a trend coming into WGC Mexico to go along with 3 top 20s in his most recent 5 events played.

Phil Mickelson – Mickelson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 3 events played. Mickelson finished 7th at this tourney last year.

Jordan Spieth – Spieth is on a trend coming into WGC Mexico to go along with 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Spieth finished 12th at this event last year.
