Shriners picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Brooks Koepka – Koepka has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Koepka finished 2nd at Shriners in 2016 and he finished 4th in 2014.

Patrick Cantlay – Cantlay has 3 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Cantlay finished 2nd at this event last year and he won in 2017.

Bryson DeChambeau – DeChambeau is trending coming into this tourney with a 13th in his most recent event played. DeChambeau is the defending champion to go with a 7th finish in 2017.

Scottie Scheffler – Scheffler has 5 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win.

Tony Finau – Finau has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Finau has 3 top 20 finishes at Shriners over the past 5 years.

Webb Simpson – Simpson has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Simpson has 3 top 20 finishes at this event over the past 5 years.

Jason Kokrak – Kokrak has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Kokrak finished 20th at this tourney in 2017.

Collin Morikawa – Morikawa is on a trend coming into Shriners with 2 top 10s in his most recent 5 events played, including a win.

Gary Woodland – Woodland is on a trend coming into this event with a 15th finish in his most recent event played. Woodland finished 10th at Shriners last year and he finished 18th in 2017.

Scott Piercy – Piercy hasn't missed a cut in his most recent 5 events played. Piercy has 4 top 25 finishes at Shriners over the past 5 years (2 top 10s).
