

Sony 2019 Picks

Sony picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Gary Woodland – Woodland has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Woodland finished in the top 10 in 3 of the past 4 years at Sony.

Justin Thomas – Thomas has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Thomas finished 14th at Sony last year, he won in 2017 and he finished 6th in 2015.

Marc Leishman – Leishman has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including a win and 2 top 5s. Leishman finished 5th at this event in 2014 (his best in the past 5 years).

Bryson DeChambeau – DeChambeau has 5 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win.

Andrew Putnam – Putnam has 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 3 events played and he is on a slight trend coming into this tourney.

Kevin Kisner – Kisner is on a trend coming into the Sony with a 7th finish in his most recent event. Kisner has 3 top 25 finishes at this event over the past 3 years.

Scott Piercy – Piercy has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Piercy has 3 top 25 finishes at this tourney over the past 4 years.

Patton Kizzire – Kizzire is on a trend coming into Sony with an 8th finish in his most recent event played. Kizzire is the defending champion.

Charles Howell III – Howell has 3 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Howell also has 3 top 15 finishes at Sony over the past 5 years.

Emiliano Grillo – Grillo has 4 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played and he is on a trend coming into this event.
