

Valero 2019 Picks

Valero picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Lucas Glover – Glover has 4 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played (3 top 10s). Glover is also on a trend coming into this event.

Billy Horschel – Horschel is on a slight trend coming into Valero with 3 top 30 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Horschel finished 11th at this tourney last year (4th in 2016; 3rd in 2015).

Jason Kokrak – Kokrak has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Kokrak's best finish over the past 5 years at Valero is 11th in 2015.

Aaron Baddeley – Baddeley has 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played (2 top 10s). Baddeley was 16th at this tourney last year and 5th in 2017.

Justin Harding – Harding has 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a win.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler has 2 top 2 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win.

Joost Luiten – Luiten has 4 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played (3 top 10s).

Jim Furyk – Furyk has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including 2 top 10s. Furyk's best finish at Valero over the past 5 years is 6th in 2014.

Sungjae Im – Im has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played.

Matt Kuchar – Kuchar has 4 top 30 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a 2nd at Match Play last week. Kuchar finished 4th at Valero in 2014.
